Creative Art Exhibits Rules and Regulations

- 1. All articles may be checked in between 2 and 5 p.m., Sunday, September 14, and between 1 and 6 p.m. Monday, September 15, 2025. **Confections will be accepted on Monday only and judged that evening.** Due to Food Safety Regulations, confections brought on Sunday will not be judged. Fair workers will be allowed to check in 1 hour prior to public check-in.
- 2. All articles are to be <u>checked out from 2 to 4 p.m., Sunday, September 21st.</u> Check out before this time (unless approved by fair board) will result in forfeit of ribbon and/or premium money. Fair workers will be allowed to check out 1 hour prior to public check out. Exhibitors must go through department chairman before checking out. Only the exhibitor may check articles out and will be required to sign a check-out form.
- 3. Premiums will be paid on a point basis. Premiums will be paid by check. Checks should be cashed as soon as possible or endorsed and returned to the Prairie County Fair and Livestock Show, c/o Melissa Sanders, PO Box 178, Hazen, AR 72064.

Creative Art Exhibits

Rules and Regulations

- 4. All exhibits must be entered in the name of the grower, maker, or owner. Exhibitor must be a resident of Prairie County or a 4-H, FFA, FCCLA, or Extension Homemaker member currently enrolled in a club or attend school in the county. A release form must be signed forfeiting right to enter exhibits in county fair of residence.
- 5. All articles must be the work of the person exhibiting. All articles must have been completed since September 2024. All articles must have an entry tag with the exhibitor's complete name, telephone number and complete mailing address. (Youth should include age)
- 6. All items should be clean, neat and well made.
- 7. Divisions will include Pee Wee (5-8), Junior (9-19) and Adult. Junior is up to age 19, before January 1, not married and must have been enrolled in school during 2025-2026 school year or be currently enrolled in school (public, private or home school).
- 8. Each item will be judged on its own merit. Out of county judges will be secured. **The judges' decision is final.** Best of Show and Judge's Awards will only be awarded if judges' feel it is merited.
- 9. Any exhibit previously shown in another county fair will not be eligible for the 2025 fair judging (May display only).
- 10. Only one exhibit may be entered in each class by an individual. An individual may not compete against him/herself.
- 11. Every effort will be made to protect all exhibits, but loss, damage and accidents will be at owner's risk. The Prairie County Livestock Fair Association will not accept the responsibility for any article.
- 12. All announcements made in the catalog are subject to change in case of emergency, and the Fair Board Executive Committee reserves the right to make and announce such changes at any time it seems necessary for interest of the fair.
- 13. All department chairmen will be responsible for properly checking in, supervising the judging, and checking out exhibits. **No departments will be allowed to observe judging except in their own department.**
- 14. Items made from kits are acceptable.
- 15. You will be responsible for exhibits to go to the District Fair in Pine Bluff.
- 16. The Charge for Commercial and Informational Booths inside is \$40.00, Outside Booths \$50.00, \$100.00 for Arena.
- 17. At least one-third of state premium money is earmarked for 4-H, FFA, and FCCLA members.

Educational Exhibits

Chairpersons: Emilee Moody

Divisions: Junior and Adult

Educational Exhibits are the only booths eligible for judging. (4-H, EHC, Master Gardeners, and school organizations such as FFA or FCCLA)

First place winners receive \$35
Second place winners receive \$25
Third place winners receive \$15
All participants receive \$10

Educational Exhibits will be judged and awarded points by the following criteria:

COMPONENTS

Appropriateness of Theme (15 points)

- Educational and/or Promotional Message
- Timely, Important, Practical
- Message Suited for the Viewing Audience

Presentation (50 points)

- Attracts Attention Light, motion, sound, color, size, etc.
- Title of Exhibit Attractive, catchy, easy to read; appropriate placement
- **Design** Good use of color; Center of interest; Unity and movement; Contrast; Balance; Proportion to scale
- Printed Visuals Appropriate size; Appropriate placement; Neat and easy to read

Effectiveness (35 points)

- Message Accurate, Concise, and Simple Only one subject covered; unnecessary material eliminated
- Educational or Promotional Effectiveness Increases knowledge; Changes attitude: Creates a desire for involvement

- Compliance with all rules is the responsibility of the exhibitor. All livestock must comply with the appropriate health requirements and livestock exhibitors must have their paperwork to satisfy the livestock inspector from the Livestock and Poultry Commission and the Barn Superintendent.
- 2. All Livestock must be checked in by the official on duty at the barn and shall be left in place until Saturday at 3:00 pm. Any exhibitor withdrawing livestock before then will forfeit all premium and prize money.

- 3. All animals must be entered in the name of the exhibitor. Beef steers must have been owned by the exhibitor for at least 90 days prior to the fair and all other livestock must have been owned by the exhibitor for at least 60 days prior to the fair. Any animal not shown by the owner understands that premium money will be based on owner age, not on age of person showing animal.
- 4. All premium money will be paid on a point basis. Checks will not be distributed until after the animals have been removed from the pens and the pens have been cleaned. Water, feed, hay, water hoses, water trough, and ropes or halters must be provided by the exhibitor. Each will be expected to feed and care for his animals including removal of soil bedding and the replacement of fresh bedding. Failure to do so will result in forfeiture of premium monies.
- 5. Pens will be assigned by the Barn Superintendent on the first come, first serve basis. Pen space is strictly for animals; absolutely no tack shall take up pen space.
- 6. Animals are not to be unloaded or put into a pen or stall until they have been cleared by the Barn Superintendent.
- 7. Poultry and Rabbits will be judged Friday, September 19, 2025 at 5:00 p.m. Livestock will be judged Saturday at 9:00 a.m. The judges will determine if any or all classes will be exhibited in the show.
- 8. At least one-third of the state premium money is earmarked for 4-H, FFA, and FCCLA members that enter items and/or livestock.
- 9. No Liability is assumed by the Prairie County Fair Association or management with respect to any entry, exhibit, participant, or spectator.
- 10. All exhibitors must be residents of Prairie County in order to receive any premium monies or awards. Any exhibit previously shown in another county fair will not be eligible for judging (may display only).
- In all cases the superintendent reserves the right to accept or reject ANY entry. Only articles which have merit and which will be a credit to both the exhibitor and the fair will be entered and shown.
- 12. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to care for the animal or livestock on a daily basis. Any animal(s) not being cared for will receive a verbal warning on the 1st offense from the barn superintendent and will be asked to take animals or livestock home on the 2nd offense.
- 13. Juniors are under 19 years of age or unmarried.

- 14. The PeeWee, Junior and Adult Divisions will be judged separately.
- 15. Read all rules at the beginning of each section. Items may be disqualified if ALL RULES are not followed.
- 16. In no event shall the Prairie County Fair Officers, Directors or Members of any Committee be held responsible for any loss or damaged to the property of exhibitors, or other people while on the fairgrounds, whether loss or damaged arose from accident or any cause whatsoever. All diligence will be used by the Fair Board to prevent any mishaps to entries.
- 17. No entries will be accepted after their specified time.
- 18. There will be no entry fee for any Prairie County resident or school student that enters an Article or Livestock. (Please note Prairie County Fair and Livestock does not have an Open Show)
- 19. Competent judges will be furnished by the management of the Fair and their decision will be final.
- 20. The Prairie County Fair Association will reject entries of any Livestock showing any symptoms of diseases.
- 21. If there is no competition in a class, the judges will award whatever prize deemed necessary.
- 22. All controversies will be settled by the Barn Superintendent.
- 23. Exhibitors must own and be primary caretakers of the animals.
- 24. Bulls, 12 months or older, must have a nose ring lead.
- 25. All animals entered in breeding classes must be registered in the exhibitor's name as evidenced by registration papers. It is intended that only animals that are creditable from the standpoint of type, quality, and finish shall be entered.
- 26. Girls and Boys 9 to 19 years of age who are a residents of the county, attend school in the county and/or belong to 4-H, FFA, and /or Family Consumer Sciences are eligible to show in the Junior Division. Exhibitors will be considered Juniors in the year of their 9th birthday through the year after High School Graduation.

- 27. Exhibitors prior to their 9th birthday will be considered Pee Wee and may show in the PeeWee Division.
- 28. The fair board of any county, district, state reserves the right to have blood and urine laboratory analysis made for any animal at the fair.
- 29. Any exhibitor administering a drug to an animal which would render the carcass unfit for human consumption or any exhibitor of animal producing and analysis indicating on the presence of an unapproved drug that can result in a quantitative or qualitative change in the characteristic of the animal will be required to return all premium money and could be banned from further competition. Their name and the lab analysis will be submitted to the USDA and FDA for further investigation and possible prosecution.
- 30. All Poultry must have a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test before entering fairgrounds.
- 31. Livestock entries will be released at 3:00 pm Saturday. Premium will be forfeited if moved out earlier.
- 32. Animals shown in Junior Division are to be shown by the individuals owning them unless unavoidable circumstances forbid. In which case, the superintendent will name someone not over 19 years of age to show the animal.
- The Health Certificate from Veterinarians and breed registration papers will be checked before animals are unloaded.
- 34. All Market steers, lambs, goats and hogs and commercial females will be required to participate in the Arkansas Validation Program to exhibit at the Arkansas State Fair, Arkansas Youth Expo, and other county or district fairs (if you choose to participate). Prairie County Livestock Show does NOT currently require validation of livestock.
- 35. If exhibitor wishes to show at district or state, please contact your FFA advisor or 4H agent for more information.



Department 1: Food Preservation

Chairperson: Diane Weatherford **Divisions:** Adult and Junior

Rules:

- No artificial flavoring or coloring may be used (ex. food coloring, jello, etc.)
- No paraffin on jelly.
- Low acid foods, like vegetables, must be pressure canned. High acid and acidified foods, like tomatoes, pickles, jams, and jellies must be processed in a boiling water canner or pressure canned.
- No canned squash including summer, zucchini, or spaghetti. Pickled summer squash and zucchini are allowed.
- Potatoes must be whole or cubed, no pureed or mashed potatoes. No pureed or mashed pumpkin.
- Canning jars must be of appropriate size and clear Mason type. Lids and rings MUST be metal. No plastic lids or rings are allowed.

All food preservation entries will need to be labeled with product name, method of preservation, and date canned and placed on front of jar.

Labels should not obstruct the judge's ability to see the product!

All food preservation entries MUST have been preserved within the past 12 months. NO exceptions!
